



Introducing the “Dermatosurgery Corner”

Dermatosurgery represents a core component of modern dermatology, encompassing a wide spectrum of procedures ranging from conventional surgical excision and micrographic surgery techniques to cryosurgery and other destructive therapies. These approaches are central to the management of skin cancers and other cutaneous tumors, requiring both technical expertise and sound clinical judgment.

Despite continuous advances in surgical techniques, imaging, and perioperative care, several aspects of dermatosurgical practice remain variable across institutions and clinicians. These include indications for specific procedures, margin selection, integration with diagnostic tools, and strategies to optimize functional, cosmetic, and oncologic outcomes.

As Section Editor for Dermatosurgery and Editor-in-chief, respectively, we have observed a growing interest in this field among our readership, reflected by an increasing number of submissions and the evolving scope of research in dermatologic surgery.

Based on these considerations, we have decided to launch a new section in Dermatology Practical & Conceptual

dedicated to dermatosurgery, named the “Dermatosurgery Corner.” The aim is to promote high-quality publications addressing key topics in dermatologic surgery, including clinical decision-making, surgical techniques, emerging technologies, and outcomes research.

Particular emphasis will be placed on practical and clinically relevant contributions, including review articles, position or opinion papers, original articles or case series, and educational articles that provide clear guidance and actionable insights for daily practice. Contributions spanning the full spectrum of dermatosurgery, from destructive treatments and traditional excisions to more advanced Mohs micrographic surgery, are encouraged.

We believe that this new section will serve as a valuable resource for both clinicians in training and experienced dermatologic surgeons, ultimately contributing to improved patient care and outcomes in the management of skin cancer and other surgically treated skin diseases.
